**What Does It All Mean?** No violations, not a one. Your water is as safe as it gets. There were no violations and none of the constituents detected were even close to a maximum contaminant level (MCL). Although the constituents in your water are not close to a maximum contaminant level, you should understand just how much allowance for safety is built in when those levels are set. If an individual were to drink two liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime (remember, we're not even remotely close to an MCL), there would still only be a one-in-a-million chance of experiencing an adverse health effect.

**Health and Water...** According to the Environmental Protection Agency and the Center for Disease Control, some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised individuals such as people with cancer who are undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have had organ transplants, those with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers.
